





The BESS programme

- £14M, 6-year programme from Feb 2011 to Jan 2017, co-ordinated from York
- 4 consortia awarded Spring 2012, working across focal landscapes
- **5 inter-disciplinary studentships** aligned to BESS science awarded Summer 2012
- 2 BESS Fellowships AO 1st October 2012
- **Gap-filling Research Grants** (c. £1M) AO 1st October 2012
- The Tansley Centre: NCEAS-style programme, £250K for first two years
